

ZKANAEIA

Στή νήσο τῶν Κυθήρων, πρώτη ἡ Δίς Μπέντον τῆς Βρεττανικῆς ᾿Αρχαιολογικῆς Σχολῆς ᾿Αθηνῶν, ἀνεκάλυψε τό 1932 ἕνα μινωῖκό οἰκισμό στό ᾿Ακρωτήριο Καστρί, πού ἀντικρύζει τήν Κρήτη. Ἐκεῖ, κατά τόν Θουκυδίδη καί τόν Παυσανία, βρισκόταν ἡ ἀρχαία πόλη Σκάνδεια.

Δυό μίλια πρός τά ἐνδότερα, στό ὄρος Παλαιόκαστρο, ἀρχαιολόγοι εἶχαν παρατηρήσει ἐρείπια τῆς Ἑλληνικῆς περιόδου, μεταξύ τῶν ὁποίων δωρικά κιονόκρανα ποὺ εἶχαν χρησιμοποιηθῆ γιὰ τὴν οἰκοδόμησι τοῦ Ναοῦ τοῦ 'Αγίου Κοσμᾶ. Τὰ κιονόκρανα αῦτά (δος π.χ. αἰών) ἀνῆκαν πιθανόν στόν παλαιότερο ναόν τῆς 'Αφροδίτης, ποὺ τὴν λατρεία της, κατὰ τὸν 'Ηρόδοτο, εἰσήγαγαν στὸ νησὶ οἱ Φοίνικες. Πάνω σιὐτό τό θουνό βρισκόταν ἡ "Ανω πόλις τῶν 'Αρχαίων Κυθήρων, πού καταστράφηκε τό 424 π.χ. ἀπό τὸν 'Αθηναῖο στρατηγό Νικία, ὅταν τὸ νησί ῆταν σπαστιατική ἀποικία.

'Από τό 1963, ἐπί τρεῖς περιόδους, μικτή ἀποστολή τοῦ Μουσείου τοῦ Πανεπιστιμίου τῆς Πενσυλδανίας καί τῆς Βρεττανικῆς Σχολῆς 'Αθηνῶν ἐξετέλεσε ἀνασκαφές στό Καστρί, θέλοντας νά ρίξη φῶς στή περίοδο τῆς μινωῖκῆς κατοχῆς,στίς σχέσεις τοῦ νησιοῦ μέ τήν Κρήτη καί μέ τήν 'Ηπειρωτική 'Ελλάδα κατά τήν περίοδο τῆς κρητικῆς ναυτικῆς ἰσχύος. Έτσι στὴν κοιλάδα τοῦ ποταμοῦ τῆς παλαιοπόλεως, που ἄλλοτε ῆταν ὅρμος καί κατά τήν μινωῖκή περίοδο χρησίμευε σάν λιμάνι, (ὁ Στράδων μᾶς λέγει πώς τό λιμάνι αὐτό είχε μῆκος πεντακόσια μέτρα καί πλάτος διακόσια μέτρα, ὁ δέ πληθυσμός τοῦ νησιοῦ, ῆτο 10.000 κάτοικοι). 'Όνακαλύφθησαν σπίτια τῆς 'Υστερομινωϊκῆς περιόδου (1.400 π.χ.), μὲ μικρὰ θεμέλια καὶ στενές πόρτες, ὅμοια μ' ἐκεῖνα τῆς μινωῖκῆς Κρήτης. Κάτω ἀπό τά σπίτια ἀνακαλύφθηκαν ἀγγεῖα δμοια μέ ἐκεῖνα πού ἐχρησιμοποιοῦντο στήν Κρήτη κατά τίς ἀρχές τῆς Μεσομινωῖκῆς περιόδου (περίπου 2.000 π.χ.), ἔνδειξη, ὅτι ἡ Κριτικὴ ἀποικία ἱδρύθηκε περίπου τὴν ἐποχὴ ἐκείνη. Επίσης ἀνακαλύφθησαν ἀγγεῖα πολύχρωμα, τῆς ἱδιας ἐποχῆς, δαμμένα μὲ πορφύρα ἐνὸς ὀστράκου, γιὰ τὸ ὁποῖο ἐνδέχεται οἱ Κρῆτες νὰ εῖχον ἐμπορικὸ ἐνδιαφέρον γιὰ τοῦτο καὶ ἐγκαταστάθηκαν στὰ Κύθηρα.

Τὴν ἐποχὴ αὐτὴν ἡ Σκάνδεια μὲ τὴν πόλη Κύθηρα, εὐρΙσκοντο σὲ μεγάλη οἰκονομικὴ ἀκμὴ καὶ εὐημερία. Τὴν πρόοδό τους δέ, ὅφειλαν σὲ τρεῖς πηγές; α) στὸ ψάρεμα τῶν ὀστράκων τῆς πορφύρας στὸν κόλπο τοῦ σημερινοῦ Αὐλείμονος καὶ στὴν ἐπεξεργασία τῆς πορφύρας. β) Τὸ λιμάνι τῆς Σκάνδειας ἡταν διαμετακομιστικὸς ἐμπορικὸς σταθμός μεταξὸ ᾿Ανατολικῆς καὶ Δυτικῆς Μεσογείου. γ) Ἡ λατρεία τῆς Θεᾶς ᾿Αφροδίτης. Εἰς τὰ Κύθηρα ἡ Θεὰ ᾿Αφροδίτη, ἐλατρεύετο σὰν Οὐράνια Αφροδίτη, ἐπειδή ἦταν κόρη τοῦ Οὐρανοῦ, καὶ ἐθεωρεῖτο προστάτις τοῦ ἀθώου ἔρωτα, καὶ τοῦ συζύγικοῦ δεσμοῦ. Ὅσοι λοιπὸν ἀγαποῦσαν τὸν ἀγνὸ ἔρωτα, τὸν νόμιμο ἔρωτα, ὅσοι ἐπιθυμοῦσαν νὰ συσφιχθοῦν οἱ δεσμοί τῆς συζυγικοῦ τους ζωῆς, ἐπήγαιναν στὰ Κύθηρα, καὶ μπροστὰ στὸ ἄγαλμα τῆς Θεᾶς, ζητοῦσαν τὴν προστασίαν της.

Σέ στρώμα κάπως βαθύτερο ἀνακαλύφθηκαν τρία σημαντικὰ εὐρήματα: Ένα κωνικὸ ἀγγεῖο ἀπό πράσινη πέτρα, δύο ἀσημένια κύπελλα πολύ φθαρμένα καὶ—τοῦτο στάθηκε ἕνα εθρημα πολὺ ἀσυνήθιστο—μιὰ χάντρα κατεργασμένου χρυσοῦ, μήκους ἑνὸς ἑκατοστοῦ, πάνω στὴν ὁποία εἶχαν χαραχθῆ τέσσερις μικροσκοπικές, μινωῖκῶν χαρακτηριστικῶν, μορφές, μὲ μικρά στόματα.

'Εκσκαφές που ἔγιναν πρὸς Β. τοῦ Καστριοῦ, γιὰ νὰ διαπιστωθῆ ἡ ἕκταση τοῦ μινωϊκοῦ οἰκισμοῦ, ὑτῆρξαν ἀρκετὰ ἀποδοτικές. Πουθενὰ ὅμως στὸ ἀνεσκαμμένο τμῆμα τοῦ μινωϊκοῦ οἰκισμοῦ, δὲν βρέθηκε ἵχνος οἰκοδομῆς μεταξὸ τῆς 'Υστερομινωϊκῆς περιόδου (1400-1300 π.χ.) καὶ τοῦ 6ου μ.χ., οὕτε καὶ μαρτυρία ότι ὁ οἰκισμὸς καταστράφηκε ἀπὸ πυρκαϊὰ ἢ σεισμὸ. Φαίνεται ὅτι οἱ ἄποικοι ἀπεσύρθηκαν σ' ἐποχὴ (περίπου τὸ 1450 π.χ.) ποὺ ἡ δύναμις τῶν Μυκηνῶν ηὕξανε εἰς βάρος τῆς Κρήτης. Συμπεραίνεται λοιπὸν ὅτι οἱ Μινωϊκοὶ ἐγκατέλειψαν τὸ Καστρὶ τὴν ἐποχὴ ποὺ ἡ Κνωσσὸς δέχθηκε τὴν ἐξ 'Ελλάδος εἰσβολή.

"Ο χῶρος τοῦ προγράμματος δὲν μᾶς ἐπιτρέπει νὰ ἐπεκταθοῦμε περισσότερο. ᾿Απομένει ὅμως ἀκόμη κλείνοντας ἔτσι τὸ ἱστορικὸ τῆς ΣΚΑΝΔΕΙΑΣ», νὰ ἐντοπισθῆ τὸ κέντρον αὐτῆς. ᾿Αλλὰ τὸ κυριώτερο ἐνδιαφὲρον τῶν ἀνασκαφῶν ἔγκειται στὴν Μινωϊκὴ ἀποικία, τὴν ἀρχαιότερη ἀποικία πέρα ἀπὸ τὶς ἀκτές τῆς Κρήτης.


SCHOOL FOR MUR-MORMAL CHARACTER AND ADDRESS OF THE PARTY OF THE PARTY




Many thanks to the Honourable Consul-General, Mr. Rellas, for sponsoring our Ball this year.

SYNOPTICAL HISTORY OF ANCIENT SKANDIA

The name SKANDIA, given to our Annual Ball this year, is the name of an ancient leading town in Kythera, the history of which goes back to the dawn of Greek civilisation. According to historians Thucydides and Pausanias, Skandia was situated on the present-day Kastri Promontory where, in 1932, Miss Benton of the British Archaeological School of Athens, discovered remnants of a Minoan housing settlement.

Two miles island, on the mount Paleokastro, archaeologists had observed ruins of the Greek period, capitals of Doric columns among them, which were later used in the building of Saint Cosma's church. These column heads, dating back to the 6th century B.C., belonged probably to the more ancient temple of Aphrodite, whose worship, according to Herodotus, was introduced to the island by the Phoenicians.

Upon this mountain was the Upper Town of Ancient Kythera, which was destroyed by the Athenian General Nikias in 424 B.C., the island then being a Spartan colony.

Since 1963, successive excavations, conducted by a mixed mission of the Museum of Pennsylvania University and the British School of Athens, have unearthed much evidence strongly pointing to the belief that ancient Kythera had been a Cretan colony and the influence of Cretan civilisation at the time Crete reigned supreme as the leading naval power in the Mediterranean.

There have been discovered houses with small foundations and narrow doors resembling those of the later Minoan period (1400 B.C.), vases similar to those used in Crete about 2000 B.C. and other many-coloured vessels typical of that Cretan period and art, and strongly suggesting that it was mainly commerce that had induced the Cretans to settle on Kythera.

At that period Skandia and the town of Kythera were enjoying great economic prosperity, due mostly to profitable fishing of porphyry shells in the gulf of present-day Avlemon, and to the fact that the port of Skandia was a centre of commercial transportation between eastern and western Meditarranean.

This, of course, is only a synoptical history of ancient Skandia, and generally Kythera, the island which, according to archaelogical, must have been the first Minoa colony beyond Cretan shores.

THE LATE A. E. McCARTNEY

ETAOIN SHRDLU CMF

It is with deep regret we report the recent passing of Mr. A. E. McCartney, former Managing Director of Consolidated Milk Industries.

Mr. McCartney devoted nearly 40 years of service wi h Consolidated Milk Industries and rose to the chief executive position with the Company on the basis of energy, ability and integrity as an administrator.

The dynamic force of Mr. McCartney was first felt when he came to help solve the milk supply problems of the organisation which was then known as Peters American Delicacy Company. He soon became a Director and the Company changed from purely an ice cream maker to one which controlled huge milk processing and distributing operations.



There were no abundant supplies of quality milk then as is the case to-day. Flood and drought and seasonal vicissitudes regularly choked supplies to a trickle. In 1938 Mr. McCartney's policy for Peters provided for the building of a milk factory at Taree. This was followed by the acquisition of Foley's and a large plant at Grafton was established. Later and more recent developments include the acquisition of the old Fresh Food and Ice Company. From then on Consolidated Milk Industries showed the way to most other sections of the industry by concentrating on milk and milk products and the result to-day is a milk processing and distributing system among the most reliable in the world.

The late Mr. McCartney had retired from the Managing Directorship of Consolidated Milik Industries at the beginning of the month in which he died. In fact, he had barely completed a round of farewell engagements before sudden death overtook him.

Apart altogether from his many contributions to the dairying industry of Australia for which he will be long remembered, many in the industry will be encouraged by his unfailing confidence which inspired the dairying industry's future and its ability to face the challenge of increasing competition. As a matter of fact, his forward thinking was expressed in many activities, including a well founded belief in applied and fundamental research within Sydney University and his observations made during many visits overseas permitted of his firm associating itself with forward thinking in respect of dairy industry products, merchandising and packaging.

The late Mr. McCartney was a man of strong character and, despite an outward appearance of toughness, he was, in fact, a man of the people, extremely humane, and understanding. His passing will be regretted by what is now a highly developed industry, a progressive firm and a wide circle of warm friends.

He is survived by his widow, sons Ted, Gordon, Alan, Malcolm, Colin and Reginald, and his daughter, Betty (Mrs. M. Skerman of Dubbo).

The company's trading policies will remain unaltered with the passing of Mr. A. E. McCartney as his son Ted was appointed to succeed him as Managing Director of Consolidated Milk Industries Limited and its subsidiaries on 1st May, 1967.

Ted had been 29 years with the Company, 16 years as Manager of the Taree plant and for 13 years at Head Office in an assisting capacity to his father.
