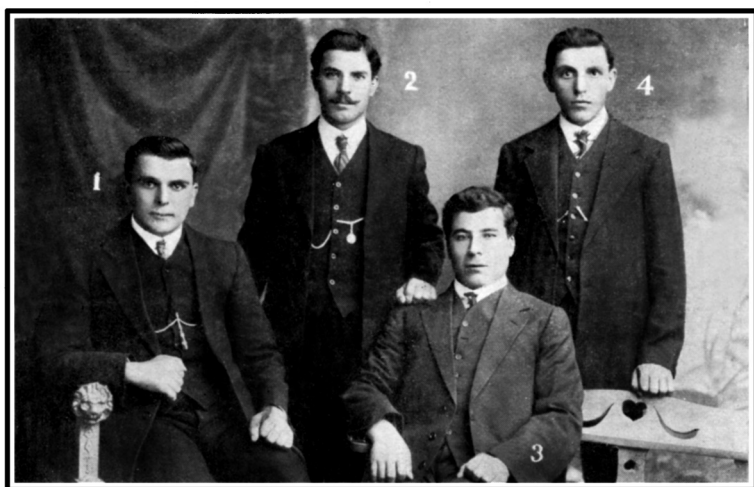


THE KRITHARIS AND TZORTZOPOULOS BROTHERS
