A Persian naval base and a pirates' lair, the "Antikythera shipwreck" in the vortex of the Roman-Cretan war

This will be a presentation about the fortified city on the island of Antikythera and the historical conclusions, based on the archaeological finds and the epigraphic and philological testimonies.

After life as a chemical engineer and a TV producer, Aris Tsaravopoulos turned to archaeology. From 1980 until 2012 he was a member of the Archeological Service of the Greek Ministry of Culture. He has been involved with many Greek sites. For over twenty years he has worked on the island of Kythera and since 2000 he has conducted a systematic excavation on the island of Antikythera at the site called "Kastro".
